



2017 New Zealand Tertiary Teams Event Rules

Open Division:

- 1) Entries
 - a. All players must be entered on the national grading list as of 1 August 2017
 - b. All players must have passed the online national club refereeing exam before the tournament commences.
 - i. This qualification is valid for two seasons e.g. if you sat the test in 2015 the exam will have expired by 2017.
 - c. All players must be enrolled in study at the New Zealand Tertiary Institution they are representing
 - i. In the event of enlisting a player from another tertiary institution, teams shall gain permission from the tournament director before entering.
 - ii. In the event of requiring a player, teams may request to use a player from Otago University via the tournament director.
- 2) Playing order
 - a. The order shall be such that a player cannot play above another player graded higher (e.g. B2 cannot play above B1).
 - b. Within each half grade players must be submitted in order of playing strength (e.g. a B2 with 2850 points may play above a B2 with 2900 points).
- 3) Teams
 - a. Teams can have up to 5 players – 4 playing, 1 reserve
 - b. In the event of a replacement of a player before the event, teams shall gain permission from the tournament director.
- 4) Disputes
 - a. Any disputes will be resolved by the disputes committee, which are the tournament director, a representative from Squash Otago and a representative from Squash New Zealand. Their decision will be final.
- 5) Draws and matches
 - a. Draws will be made by the tournament director at their discretion
 - b. Matches:
 - i. If both players are B2 or above, games will be played PAR to 11, best of 5.
 - ii. If not, games will be played PAR to 15, best of 5.
 - c. Results will be uploaded to the grading list by the tournament director no later than 3 days after the conclusion of the event.

Social Divisions:

1) Entries

- a. All players must be enrolled in study at a New Zealand Tertiary Institution
 - i. In the event of requiring a player, teams may request to use a player from Otago University via the tournament director.

2) Draws and matches

- a. Draws will be made by the tournament director at their discretion
- b. Games will be played PAR to 15, best of 5
